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### THE CLASS OF 2021-2022 GETS INTO ACTION

#### READY TO CREATE LASTING COMMUNITY IMPACT

The 2021-2022 Leadership Coachella Valley Class has sprung into action when tasked with a class project that will help our beloved Coachella Valley. With so many meaningful non-profits and charities suffering post-Covid, the class decided that the organizations who helped the under-served and often overlooked members of our community would be the focus. After many surveys of the 40 classmates, the Galilee Center in Mecca was selected based on several factors: zero government funding, the East Valley residents being hit extremely hard by the pandemic, and the amount of programs the Galilee Center provides. They are currently just shy of \$100,000 short of their efforts to fund an expansion to their currently overflowing Center, in addition to offering the following services: Infant, Children's, and Senior Services, A Farm Worker Center, Food Distribution, Holiday Food Baskets, Rental & Utility Bill Assistance, and Thrift Store Clothing Vouchers. Their impact is mighty, and they need our support now moe than ever. A rising tide lifts all boats and LCV is ready to make waves, get media coverage, and help them reach their goal. 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

### LEADERSHIP MOMENT BY SEAN WEBB, LCV ALUMNI COUNCIL

One of the toughest things a person can do is ask for something. For most of my life, as a member of my family, part of a group of friends, and in collaboration with colleagues, I've always been the person in these groups to make "the ask".

I remember as a teenager being in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, for spring break, I was lucky enough to have friends with me on the trip as many of our family friends traveled together. During the trip I was the one who asked if my friend and younger brother and I could walk down the boardwalk without our parents for the first time. To this day, I still have butterflies in my stomach as I think about it. I remember coming up with a plan and topics to share with my parents justifying why they should allow us to do so. All in all, we were able to walk down the boardwalk with my friends.

On behalf of my friends, I continued throughout the rest of grammar school and into my adult life. As a high school teacher and coach, I never had a problem with asking local businesses and community members for items for my students. As I changed roles and became an assistant principal, I now had a much larger group to "ask" for. Luckily, as long as I had a strong reason as to why I was asking, I never let it phase me.

As the new assistant principal in charge of the culinary department at La Quinta High School, I saw that there were many needs to address. One of the primary concerns was the need to fundraise so that we could have basic smallware items for the kitchen. Alongside the teacher, local chefs, and students, the concept of holding cooking competitions came about. The team discussed the cook off idea, and we decided we needed a local celebrity to emcee the event. Once again, this is where I made an "ask". With the power of social media, I was able to reach out via messenger on Facebook and I directly asked Bianca Rae, local television reporter and personality to be the emcee for the first Blackhawk Showdowns at La Quinta High School. From that "ask" it led to an amazing working friendship and relationship with Bianca. I'm happy to say that with her help and the community, we were able to successfully raise over \$75,000 for different programs at La Quinta High School. It was through my friendship with Bianca that introduced me to Leadership Coachella Valley in 2014. Since being part of the 2015-2016 #MostActiveClass, I've been happily asking LCV alumni and students for the students of DSUSD.

Yes, as time has passed the "ask" has become easier. All in all, it just has to be done, do as Nike says, "Just Do It!"
